The regular monthly meeting of the Borough Council of Lewisburg, Union County, Pennsylvania, was held at 6:30 PM on **Tuesday, May 17, 2022**, in Council Chambers, 55 South Fifth Street, Lewisburg. Present: Council President Sulai; Council Vice President Comas, Councilmembers Derman, Heayn (via telecommunication), Bilenky Trahan, and Powers; Manager Lowthert, Secretary Anders, Mayor Alvarez (via telecommunication), Solicitor Lyons, and Community Development Grant Manager Beattie. Also present: Ellen Ruby, Taylor Lightman, Rudy Mummy, Jamie Grobes, and Matt Farrand.

CALL TO ORDER: Council President Sulai called the meeting to order at 6:31 PM.

PUBLIC HEARING: Council President Sulai informed everyone there was a Lewisburg Borough 2022 Community Development Block Grant Public Hearing at 5:30 PM.

Council President Sulai adjourned the regular order of business and called the public hearing to order at 6:32 PM. Cable Franchise Agreement. Solicitor Lyons explained the public hearing is for the Cable Franchise Agreement renewal with Service Electric Cable Television Inc. is being held pursuant to section 626 of the Federal Cable Act which sets forth the process for cable franchise renewal. Service Electric Inc. currently has cable franchise agreement with the Borough of Lewisburg and has request renewal of the franchise. Renewal is the best opportunity for municipalities to assert the right with respect to the cable operators and to obtain important benefits in return granting the cable operative the right to use the publics rights of way. These benefits include but are not limited to the following: State of the art cable systems, strong customer service standards, services community facilities, better reporting for cable operators, privacy of personal information with the federal law, franchise fees for the use of the publics rights of ways, franchise fee accountability, legal protections of the rights a ways, educational and government channel, and better mechanism to enforce the franchise agreement. This public hearing is part of the preliminary portion of the franchise renewal in which municipalities do the following: 1. Review the operators past performance. 2. Identify the Borough's future cable related community needs as such we invite comments from citizen who wish to speak either regarding both the subjects and to address the benefits of the franchise renewal or any other cable related items that are important to them. Solicitor Lyons opened the hearing for citizen comments. Councilmember Derman commented it's a long document and he was glad the Borough had someone who knew what they were talking about look at it. Council President Sulai ask if this has any bearing on the fact that Service Electric also provides cable internet or if this was strictly cable television? Solicitor Lyons verified it is strictly cable television and the only reason the Borough can regulate is due to the use of the Borough's rights of way. With no other comments, Council President Sulai declared the public hearing closed at 6:37 PM and reconvened to the regular order of business.
