North Fourth Street Green Infrastructure Neighborhood Revitalization Project


Great news! The Borough has been awarded funding through the <u>Green Streets, Green Jobs, Green Towns Grant Program</u> to continue forward with planning of the North 4th Street Green Infrastructure Neighborhood Revitalization Project. Funding comes through the United States Environmental Protection Agency to the Chesapeake Bay Program. This funding will support the completion of concept designs with extensive public participation; once a final concept is identified, there will be preparation of engineered design plans for construction of the future project. The Borough's main objective is to transform a regular street re-pavement project into a cohesive plan that implements green infrastructure to reduce the rates of stormwater runoff, improve the water quality of stormwater runoff, and increase the amount of green space in the Borough. The Borough will be working with Larson Design Group to complete the planning process. Watch for announcements on the Borough's Facebook page and website for upcoming public engagement opportunities to be part of the process.

Wolfe Field Complex Master Site Development Plan is Underway

Lewisburg Borough has contracted with BSA/Landscape Architecture and LandStudies, Inc. to formulate a Master Site Development Plan (MSDP) for the park area at the northeast corner of the Borough called Wolfe Field including the Community Garden. The MSDP is funded in part by the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Community Conservation Partnership Program and Borough



A design workshop will be held at the First Presbyterian Church located at 18 Market Street. From 6:30-8:30 the public will have the opportunity to participate in a Design workshop to provide input on the development of the MSDP. Fall Leaf Collection

Leaf collection will begin on October 20, 2025 and run through December 5, 2025. Leaf collection follows the street maintenance schedule which is available online and on the street signs. Leaves must be placed in the parking spaces along the curbs prior to 6:30am on collection day. **No leaves will be collected in alleyways or on the sidewalk.** Residents are reminded that vehicles illegally parked on No Parking days will be towed during this time. Towing will begin on November 3, 2025.

TREE TRIMMING/CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Curbside collection of tree trimmings will occur the week of Monday, October 13th through Friday, October 17th. This is a semi-annual event that will follow the normal street maintenance schedule. Tree trimmings should be bundled. Trimmings must be no larger than 2" in diameter and 4' in length. All other tree trimmings can be taken to the brush pile during normal hours of operation.



Are Your Prepared for a Flood?

Much of Lewisburg Borough is susceptible to flooding. While flooding can occur at any time, historically the worst flooding occurs in Summer/early Fall (tropical storms) and Winter/early Spring (ice jams and snowmelt). Are you prepared for the next flood? Below are some tips to help you before the next flood hits:

Know your flood hazard

- The Borough is subject to flooding by the Susquehanna River, Buffalo Creek, and/or Limestone/Bull Run
- You are in a repetitively flooded area
- Call the Borough at (570) 523-3614 or SEDA-COG at (570) 524-4491 to find out the flood hazard for your property

Insure your property for your flood hazard

- Ask your insurance agent if you are covered for flood damage
- · Renters should buy flood insurance for their contents
- Do you have a flood insurance policy? If so, see if you have contents coverage
- There is a 30-day waiting period before a flood insurance policy takes effect, so call your insurance agent now

Protect people from the hazard

- If there is water on the street, turn around, don't drown
- Do not walk through flowing water
- Stay away from power lines and electrical wires
- Be aware of gas leaks

Protect your property from the hazard

- Replace your flooded furnace or other utilities with ones elevated above the base flood level
- Store your valuables and insurance papers upstairs in a waterproof container

Build responsibly

- Make sure you get a permit from the Borough before you build
- Use contractors who are familiar with the regulations regarding building in flood-prone areas

Protect natural and beneficial floodplain functions

- Protects fish and wildlife and promote diversity
- Filter nutrients and pollutants from runoff and increase water quality
- Reduce the amount of sediment entering a waterway
- Provide additional storage and decreases the velocity of floodwaters
