

A REMINDER TO RECYCLE



A reminder that recycling is mandatory in the Borough of Lewisburg. Items such as cardboard, glass, aluminum, fiberboard, etc., are all accepted at the recycling center. The recycling center, located at Wolfe Field off of St. Anthony Street, is open on Wednesdays from 8:00am—4:00pm and Saturdays from 8:00am—12noon. The Borough office offers free recycling totes for residents to use. Curbside recycling occurs on the FIRST Saturday of each month. Items for curbside pick-up include aluminum, glass, and newsprint ONLY. SPECIAL PICK-UPS

Do you have a larger item that needs to be collected for trash? Items such as mattresses, furniture or appliances are considered a "special pick-up". Our refuse crew is able to pick up these items for an additional fee—just stop into the Borough office to fill out a form and make the appropriate payment for your item(s). We also have the form available on our website if you would like to print one off at home to bring in. We can also provide a price quote if the item(s) you have are not listed.

REFUSE PRICE INCREASE

As part of the 2026 Lewisburg Borough Budget, a refuse collection charge increase was unanimously approved by council. The approved increase will raise quarterly refuse rates from \$63.00 to \$66.00 for each residential unit, and an additional 50 cents per cubic yard for accounts with containers. This decision will go into effect for the 1st Quarter of 2026, and will be reflected on the refuse statements that are mailed in April.



Do your old electronics need a new home? TVs, answering machines, keyboards, cameras, radios, etc. can be taken to the Goodwill in Lewisburg as part of their E-waste recycling program. They are located at 175 International Drive in Lewisburg. Questions about their program? Call 570-867-8079.



Snow Removal

The Borough would like to remind residents that sidewalks must be clear of snow and ice 12 hours after snow has ceased to fall/ice has ceased to form. Failure to maintain your sidewalks will result in fines. More information can be found on **Page 2**.



Collection Dates

Christmas tree collection will begin on **January 5** and continue until **January 16**. Trees must be placed curbside and all lights, ornaments, and decorations must be removed.

The Borough will be conducting curbside collection of tree trimmings the week of **Monday, April 4**, through **Friday, April 10**. This collection will follow the normal street no parking schedule. Tree trimmings should be bundled. Trimmings must be no larger than 2 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length. All other tree trimmings can be taken to the brush pile during normal hours of operation. Please remember to bring identification showing you are a Lewisburg Borough resident for all brush pile drop-offs.

Wolfe Field Complex—Master Site Development Plan is Underway

Lewisburg Borough has contracted with BSA/Landscape Architecture and LandStudies, Inc. to formulate a Master Site Development Plan (MSDP) for Wolfe Field. The MSDP is funded by the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Community Conservation Partnership Program and Lewisburg Borough. Community input has been central to this planning effort. A public survey conducted in Fall 2024 and a Community Workshop held in October 2025 engaged nearly **350 residents, stakeholders, and park users**. As the project team prepares a draft master plan, they are seeking additional feedback to help **refine and prioritize** the ideas that emerged from these earlier efforts. Your responses will directly inform decisions about recreation, conservation, access, and long-term park use. 2026 Street Projects

Lewisburg Borough has announced it's 2026 Street Improvement Projects. Timelines have not yet been determined, but will be posted online when available. Below is a listing of these projects.

Mill and Pave Areas:

- Spruce Street from St. Louis Street to the Dead End
- North 8th Street from North Derr Drive to Market Street
- North Front Street from St. John Street to St. Anthony Street, including 6 ADA ramps
- South 8th Street from St. Louis Street to White Pine Alley

Property owner's should also remove all snow and/or ice from the top of refuse containers (cans or dumpsters). Additionally, dumpsters must have the ground around the dumpster cleared of snow or ice and have a cleared path for the garbage truck to this container. Dumpsters and cans that are not cleared will not be emptied until accumulation is cleaned for the next regularly scheduled pickup day.

Also, during snow removal from the Borough streets, please observe the **No Parking** hours as posted. **Failure to do so will result in the towing of vehicles at the owner's expense.**
